

The Sunshine Home For Girls

Opened in 1992, this is a safe and caring home for girls up to the age of 18 who have been physically or sexually abused, or who have been abandoned or orphaned. The facility accommodates a maximum of 12 girls, who have been protected and nurtured even from the tender age of 6.



The Ex-Servicemen's Association

The Association (formed in 2004) provides food and medical assistance to the 6 living exsoldiers and widows who voluntarily enlisted and valiantly fought in the 1939-1945 conflict (World War II) as part of the British Colonial Territories. Currently, the needs of 8 retired soldiers from the Antigua and Barbuda Defence Force are also met.



The St. Vincent de Paul Society (Holy Family Conference)

This Society (a branch of the organization originally founded in France in 1833) operates a Day Care Centre for the elderly where they are provided with professional attention. Additionally, their "Meals on Wheels" programme distributes 50 hot meals daily to the shutins.



The Grace Programme

This initiative is executed by the Ministry of Social Transformation and caters to 300-400 elderly and differently-abled citizens across the nation. The programme has been operational since 1987 and is committed to providing dietary and social care on a regular basis. They need your help now. actual enforcement but we can discipline the person in terms of their public service permit which they obtained from us and sanction them, but the police would have to apprehend," Jarvis explained.

Consequently, he said that the Antigua and Barbuda Airport Authority should be the initial point of contact in the effort to resolve the matter.

The next step, Jarvis said, would be that the taxi drivers

"should bring the evidence to the Transport Board so that we can revoke their permits or something of the sort".

Man jailed for sex with 'girlfriend', 13

A 21-year-old has been sentenced to a year in jail for having unlawful sexual intercourse with a 13-year-old girl who was reportedly his girl-friend.

Gray's Farm resident was sentenced by Justice Iain Morley on Monday after he pleaded guilty to the offence.

The convict reportedly met the complainant in March 2019 and, according to the young girl, he was her

boyfriend.

The facts of the case as presented in court state that on the evening of May 22 2019, the man invited the girl to a house. There, in the bedroom, he began to touch the child intimately.

The girl then laid back on the bed and the convict joined her and began to unbutton her pants. She rebuttoned them but he unbuttoned them again, before removing her pants and underwear and proceeding to have sex with her.

When the victim arrived home, she was asked about her whereabouts and confessed what had happened.

A report was made to Gray's Farm Police Station and the minor was examined.

The man was subsequently charged with the offence which carries a maximum sentence of life imprisonment.

The convict claimed he didn't know that the girl was 13 years old, nor that she was still in school.

The judge considered several factors and concluded that the man should spend 12 months in jail, a portion of which was reduced as he had pleaded guilty.

He had already spent six months on remand, and will therefore only have to spend two months in prison.

Man admits to throwing 'tea bush and food' over prison wall

A man has admitted to tossing items over the prison walls which, according to him, were tea bush and a container of vegetarian food.

Akeil Burnham was

caught on Coronation Road on April 28 after throwing a bag of items over a wall.

He was subsequently arrested and charged with conveying with the intent that it should come in possession of a prisoner, possession of 45.5

grams of cannabis and beating a constable.

He pleaded not guilty to the two latter charges claiming that the drugs were not thrown over by him and that the officer in question charged him with battery because he fell and "say I have to pay for his uniform".

The man, who appeared unrepresented yesterday in St John's Magistrates' Court, also claimed that he was hired by someone to throw the pre-packaged items over the wall.

The prosecution did not accept his not guilty pleas and Chief Magistrate Joanne

Walsh therefore set Burnham's trial date for October 28.

The case was among those to come before the court on Monday.

Also appearing was Christian Hope, of Wireless Road, who was fined \$4,000 for possession of 157.8 grams of cannabis.

On July 19, police executing a search warrant at Hope's home found three bags of the controlled drug valued at \$1,578.

The man was given until October 20 to pay off the fine or he will spend five months behind bars.
